The Quantifiers indicate the amount of a name.

Some

alguno algunos

Use: Used for both countless names or nouns and for plural accounting names or nouns. Used in affirmative phrases

She has **some** apples. (*Tiene algunas manzanas.*)

Any

Signified: alguno, ninguno

Use: Used in the same contexts as "some," but in negative or interrogative phrases

I do not have any cats. (No tengo ningún gato.)

He does not have any money. (No tiene dinero.)

TOO (demasiado)	Enough(suficiente)
1. Too comes before adjectives and adverbs: It's too hot to wear that coat. I was driving too fast.	1. Enough precedes adjectives and adverbs: He isn't old enough to watch this program. We're not walking quickly enough. 2. Enough may also precede nouns: We have enough money. I haven't got enough money to buy this computer.
