What is the difference? Present Perfect and Past Simple

Present Perfect Simple	Past Simple
Unfinished actions that started in the past and continue to the present: I have known Julie for ten years (and I still know her).	Finished actions: I knew Julie for ten years (but then she moved away, and we lost touch).
A finished action in someone's life (when the person is still alive: life experience): My brother has been to Mexico three times.	A finished action in someone's life (when the person is dead): My great-grandmother went to Mexico three times.
A finished action with a result in the present: I have lost my keys! (The result is that I cannot get into my house now).	A finished action with no result in the present: I lost my keys yesterday. It was terrible! (Now there is no result. I got new keys yesterday).
With an unfinished time, word (this week, this month, today): I've seen John this week.	With a finished time, word (last week, last month, yesterday): I saw John last week.

Past Simple Present Perfect

FORM

Subject+Verb -ed/
irregular verb
Subject+didn't+infinitive
He watched TV.
He didn't watch TV.
Did he watch TV?
She wrote a poem.
She didn't write a poem.
Did she write a poem?

USAGE

Yesterday, a week ago, last year...

- a) an action is already over We visited a museum yesterday.
- b) repeated action in the past Every morning she did her exercises.
- c) a succession actions in the past One hour ago he locked his door and left the house.

Subject+have/has+past
participle
He has watched TV.
He hasn't watched TV.
Has he watched TV?
They have written a poem.
They haven't written a
poem.
Have they written a poem?

Just, yet, already, of late, since; when, until, before, after...
